

What is International Joint Class?

Schools in Seoul and overseas engage in exchange classes both online and offline, allowing students to learn different languages and cultures and build friendships with peers from diverse backgrounds.

Purpose

Cultural and emotional exchange to strengthen global competencies and build friendships.

Class Management

After matching a Seoul-based school to a school abroad, the two schools will discuss class details.

Category	Details
Language Used	As students wish (Native language, partner country's language, English, etc.)
Operation	Teachers from both countries coordinate topics, schedules, and jointly operate classes
Class Format	Online (real-time/non-real-time), Offline (mutual invitations/visits)
Online Platforms	(Real-time) Zoom, Meet / (Non-real-time) Padlet, etc.
Class Topics	Culture, Ecological Transition (SDGs), Coding, AI, Global Issues, etc.
Standard Model	Online exchange → Offline exchange → MOU signing

Process for International Joint Class





Office of Education | School Tie-up Procedure



- Demand survey (December-February)
- Collection of International Joint Class applications from schools in Korea and abroad
- School tie-up
 (March-November)
- Factoring in language, grade, quota, time, etc.
- Notification of the
 tie-up result
 (December-February)
- Provide both tie-up schools with the counterpart's information



School | Class Procedure



- 1 Prior Consultation
- Discussion on class schedule, topic, etc.
 between the teachers from tie-up schools
- 2 Roll call
- Access the platform and check attendance
- 3 Class time
- Brief self-introduction followed by the lecture and activities
- Help from remote class assistants (optional)
- Overseeing class activities
- Check on group rooms and encourage student participation
- 5 Class wrap up
- Return to the main screen and wrap-up
- Non-real-time
 + exchanges
 (optional)
- Share feedback and thoughts on the class
- Interactions through "culture boxes", letter writing, social media, e-mail, etc.

Who are remote class assistants?

Volunteer language assistants for study who provide interpretation/translation for a smooth running of International Joint Class and assist with class activities.
